Last chance to cancel appointment or you will be charged a NO SHOW FEE of \$250. Check with insurance in advance to see if you need a referral or pre-approval for your procedure. Please leave jewelry, money, and other valuables at home. If you have an electronic stimulator, bring your wand/device to turn off your stimulator. Secure a driver for the procedure day, as it is unsafe to drive for 12 hours after the procedure.	Stop For days before procedure. Stop taking Phentermine, oil supplements, oil capsules, and iron pills. If you are diabetic or if you're taking blood thinners and you did not receive specific instructions regarding your medications, please call the office. Blood thinners include Coumadin, Warfarin, Effient, Plavix, Pradaxa or Xarelto, etc. If you have implantable cardiology devices (defibrillator or pacemaker), notify the office as a device clearance is needed from your cardiologist. For EUS Patients only: If you had any GI-related radiology studies done outside Providence Hospital in Everett (CT, Ultrasound, or MRI), please request and obtain the radiology images on a CD. Bring it with you to the EUS appointment.	Entire Day No restrictions on eating or drinking. Take usual medications unless otherwise instructed. EVENING AND NIGHT CLEAR LIQUIDS ONLY AFTER MIDNIGHT. If you take <u>diabetic</u> <u>medication(s)</u> Refer to the instruction sheet "EGD Patients with Diabetes", which also applies to patients scheduled to have upper EUS and ERCP procedures.	Early morning: take your usual prescribed medication except for blood thinners, insulin or oral diabetic medication, unless told otherwise by your doctor. OK to continue clear liquid diet. FOUR HOURS PRIOR TO YOUR CHECK IN TIME ABSOLUTELY NOTHING BY MOUTH (e.g. gum, hard candy, chewing tobacco, water, etc.). AGAIN, be sure to bring: • Medication List • A Driver • Photo ID/Insurance Card • Eyeglasses/Hearing Aids Allow 4-6 hours for your EUS/ERCP procedure and recovery. You <u>CANNOT</u> drink alcohol or drive for 12 hours after the test.
