Trailblazing WWMG Turns 30

This year, WWMG celebrates our 30th year serving the Puget Sound community. Western Washington Medical Group began in Everett in the late 1980s and early 1990s, when several visionary doctors read the writing on the wall, so to speak.

Healthcare was changing. The big players—hospitals and insurance companies—were consolidating. It became clear that independent providers needed to band together to successfully navigate the emerging landscape.

With that goal in mind, a handful of local specialists in gastroenterology, cardiology, oncology and general surgery began developing the core organization that in 1993 became WWMG.

By the end of our first decade, membership of specialist providers had grown into the double digits, and primary care providers began to join. Our second and third decades brought continued growth in providers, and an expansion of service and collaborations with larger-scale regional entities such as Providence.

Dr. David Russian, who joined in 1998 and is currently WWMG's CEO, says that with change comes opportunity. Continuing the vision of the group's founders, we continue to seek ways to serve our patients better as the healthcare market changes and evolves.

Today, WWMG is home to over 100 providers, including 20 specialties and 7 primary care locations. Serving patients from Bothell to Bellingham, we're the sole remaining local, independent multi-specialty medical group in the entire Puget Sound region.

WWMG Earns 4.5 Rating for Quality

WWMG providers and staff prioritize the quality of care for each of our patients. Being an independent medical group that is locally-owned by our providers means patients can receive personalized care, rather than being treated according to protocols dictated by a huge corporation.

One of the ways we do this is through wellness-based care, one of WWMG's population health initiatives. "Wellness-based care is about working to improve health outcomes for our patients, by putting in place resources that support them in prevention and wellness," says Teresa Litton, Director of Population Health and Payer Strategies at WWMG.

Such resources include:

- calling patients to schedule routine visits
- care management for chronic issues
- remote monitoring technology •
- follow-up consultations after hospital discharge, and
- health coaching to help • Medicare patients manage medications.

Two additional services available at WWMG primary care locations are: specialized diabetic eye exams that can be completed during a regular checkup, and a mobile Mammogram Van in partnership with Seattle Cancer Care Alliance/ Fred Hutch Cancer Center.

For non-life threatening issues that require same-day treatment, WWMG offers patients: sameday primary care appointments at multiple locations, a telehealth service for "virtual walk-ins," and a partnership with Dispatch Health for urgent care house calls as alternatives to visiting the ER.



Value-based care is an industrywide transition from fee-forservice to wellness-based healthcare. In the midst of these changes, WWMG is shining bright, advancing in just two years from a 3.5- to a 4.5-star quality rating in the 5-star system used by insurance companies to measure patient outcomes and quality of care.

Accurate Diagnosis is First Step for Sinusitis Relief

Chronic sinusitis is sometimes misdiagnosed because its symptoms of pain, pressure, congestion and runny nose overlap with other conditions.

"It feels like a constant cold, may be unresponsive to medication, symptoms can wax and wane but be a lifelong problem, and often co-occur with migraines and allergies," explains Dr. Jamie Litvack, WWMG's Ear, Nose & Throat physician and surgeon.

Dr. Litvack has a particular interest in helping patients with sinusitis. "Sometimes patients have received multiple rounds of treatment with antibiotics or steroids without improving, because the problem is not an infection. It's very satisfying to see what a difference the right

diagnosis makes in their quality of life."

Using what she calls "a small spaghetti camera," Dr. Litvack can look inside the nose to check for a deviated septum, narrowness at the back of the nasal cavity, polyps, or other telltale causes. "It's a much larger space than it seems from the outside, and can give me a lot of information to determine the correct diagnosis."

Once diagnosed, treatment for chronic sinusitis may include saline irrigations, topical and oral medications, in-office procedures, injectable biologics, or surgery.

pipeline to larger-scale studies than we have undertaken before, and to more screening trials that emphasize prevention." WWMG is currently enrolling patients in clinical trials for:

- Breast, colorectal, and lung cancer
- Renal disease
- Low-dose CT lung cancer screening
- Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis and
- Cardiovascular disease

Two other research trials are launching this January, one for a COVID/RSV/flu "home triple test" and the other for an RSV elderly vaccine.
